Sir,

Please refer to your RTI application bearing Regd. No. DOFND/R/E/20/00030/1 dated 17/09/2020 seeking information under RTI Act, 2005. Insofar as the Fisheries Department, Government of India is concerned this Department is being implemented an integrated scheme under the umbrella of Self-reliant India (*Atmanirbar Bharat Abhiyan*) Special package in Fisheries Sector namely "Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY)"- a scheme to bring about Blue Revolution through sustainable and responsible development of fisheries sector in the country over a period of 5 years from FY 2020-21 to FY 2024-25 in all States/Union Territories. The detail of scheme, beneficiaries oriented components, cost norms/ subsidies are available in the Guidelines of the ongoing PMMSY scheme. The guidelines of scheme issued by the Department for its implementation is also available in the Department's website: <http://dof.gov.in>.

2. Besides, Recognizing the potential of the fisheries sector, the Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) "Blue Revolution" was launched during 2015-16 for the Integrated Development and Management of Fisheries for a period of 5 years up to 2019-20. The Blue Revolution Scheme has been completed by its tenure 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020. Moreover, to fill up the infrastructure gaps in fishery sector, In 2018, Government of India has created the dedicated Fisheries and Aquaculture Infrastructure Development Fund (FIDF) worth Rs.7522 crore, under which there is provision to provide 3% interest subvention to various entities in the country.

3. The Government of India in 2018-19 extended the facility of Kisan Credit Card (KCC) to fisheries and animal husbandry farmers to help them meet their working capital needs. The KCC facility will help fisheries and animal husbandry farmers to meet their short term credit requirements of rearing of animals, poultry birds, fish, shrimp, other aquatic organisms and capture of fish.

4. The first appeal, if any, against this reply may be made to the first Appellate Authority within 30 days of receipt of this letter.
