
I am directed to refer to this Department's letter No.J- 117012-1/2020 -Fy dated 12th June, 2020 through which administrative approval of Government of India has been conveyed for implementation of the "Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana - A scheme to bring about Blue Revolution through sustainable and responsible development of fisheries sector in India" in all the States/Union Territories (UTs) for a period of 5 years from the financial year 2020-21 to 2024-25 at a total investment of Rs. 20050 crore (Rupees: Twenty thousand fifty crore only) comprising of (i) Central share of Rs. 9407 crore, (ii) State share of Rs. 4880 crore and (iii) Beneficiaries' share of Rs. 5763 crore.

2. Administrative Approval for 2020-21 and 2021-22 have already been issued vide letter of even number dated 12th June 2020 and 3rd May, 2021 respectively. Now, in continuation, Administrative Approval of Government of India is hereby conveyed for implementation of the "Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana - A scheme to bring about Blue Revolution through sustainable and responsible development of fisheries sector in India" during the financial year 2022-23 with a central share of Rs. 1879 crore (Rupees: One thousand eight hundred seventy-nine crore only) in all the States and Union Territories.

3. The PMMSY is implemented as an umbrella scheme with two separate components namely (a) Central Sector Scheme (CS) and (b) Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS). The Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) Component is further segregated into Non-beneficiary oriented and beneficiary orientated sub-components/activities under the following three broad heads:

- (i) Enhancement of Production and Productivity
- (ii) Infrastructure and Post-harvest Management
- (iii) Fisheries Management and Regulatory Framework

4. The PMMSY intends to address critical gaps in fish production and productivity, quality, technology, post-harvest infrastructure and management, modernisation and strengthening of value chain, traceability, establishing a robust fisheries management framework and fishers' welfare. The detailed Operational Guidelines indicating the funding pattern, mode of submission of proposals, evaluation and approval of proposals, fund release and monitoring mechanism, cost norms with associated terms and conditions relating to implementation of various activities under the components and sub-components of the

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PMMSY have been issued vide this Departments' letter No. J-117012-3/2020 dated 24th June, 2020. Further, the Administrative Approval, the Operational Guidelines of PMMSY, specific guidelines on administrative cost, entrepreneurship model, training and capacity building under PMMSY and other amendments and addendums to the Operational Guidelines of PMMSY have been issued and also uploaded on the Department's website (<http://www.dof.gov.in>) and the PMMSY website (<http://www.pmmsy.dof.gov.in>) for necessary action and reference.

5. In the Budget 2022-23, an outlay of **Rs. 1879 crore (Rupees: One thousand eight hundred seventy-nine crore)** has been allocated for implementation of the PMMSY during the financial year 2022-23 and the Head of account-wise details of the allocated budget for financial year 2022-23 is as below:

6. Accordingly, the State Governments/UT Administrations and their entities are requested to formulate specific action plan, strategy and roadmap for development and management of fisheries in their respective State/UTs and submit suitable Self-contained proposals/DPRs for sanction for the year 2022-23 in accordance with the operational guidelines. While formulating the action plan, strategy and the proposals, the State Governments/UTs are expected to consult the relevant stakeholders and keep their concerns and interests in mind. Similarly, the Central Government Entities and the End Implementing Agencies approved by Department of Fisheries (DoF), GoI are also requested to submit Detailed Project Reports (DPRs)/Self Contained Project proposals in respect of the activities proposed to be taken up by them in accordance with the provisions and Guidelines etc. of PMMSY for availing central financial assistance under the PMMSY.

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7. The PMMSY encompasses inclusive development and the marginalized groups such as SC/STs, differently abled, women and women headed household are also envisaged as stakeholders in development of fisheries and aquaculture. Accordingly, for FY 2022-23, 16.6% and 8.6% of the allocated funds have been earmarked for Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) respectively and these funds are to be utilized exclusively for development of SCs/STs. The funds earmarked for SCSP & TSP among various budget heads can be seen in table in para-5 above. Accordingly, the End Implementing Agencies i.e. Central Government entities including the National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB), are requested to include suitable interventions/activities for supporting SC/ST population appropriately in their respective Annual Action Plans or Project Proposals. Similarly State Governments/UTs may make specific allocation of funds for SCs/STs in their Annual Action Plan/Self-contained proposals/DPRs based on the percentage of SC/ST population in their jurisdiction.

8. For availing central assistance under Centrally Sponsored Scheme Component of PMMSY, the State Governments/UTs shall specifically indicate in their Annual Action Plans and Project Proposals, the availability of budgetary provision in the State budget and willingness to meet the State's share as per the funding pattern of PMMSY along with necessary clearances and land availability wherever necessary.

9. This administrative approval is issued subject to the following:

- (i) The provision of General Financial Rule, 2017 shall be applicable.
- (ii) Release of funds shall be as per Cash Management System Guidelines issued by the Budget Division, Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance.
- (iii) The flow of funds is to be ensured through PFMS/DBT platforms.
- (iv) The States will strictly ensure compliance of guidelines on Single Nodal Agency issued from time-to-time by the Ministry of Finance.
- (v) The Central/State Implementing Agencies shall ensure registration of all implementing agencies till last level and use of Expenditure, Advance and Transfer (EAT) module of Public Finance Management System (PFMS) for flow of funds so that effective monitoring of funds utilization can be done as per the Rule (232) (v) of GFR 2017.
- (vi) Utilization Certificates shall be through PFMS in accordance with Guidelines issued in this regard by CCA, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying. It is to be noted that Utilization Certificate not supported by EAT module is likely to be rejected and expenditure will not be treated as regular.

10. This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority vide Dy No. E-15991 dated 22nd April, 2022.
